Dogs are not allowed as they can disturb and harm wildlife. If you need to, you can walk your dog (on a short lead) along the public right of way. Assistance dogs are welcome.



Recycling bins are provided for your use in the car park and the Visitor Village.

## WATCH OUT!

Take care near open water. Keep an eye on any children with you.

The reserve is prone to flooding at certain times of year. Please take note of any warning signs.

In winter the reserve road is gritted. Paths on the reserve and around the Visitor Village are untreated as rock salt harms wildlife and plants.

### The following activities are not allowed on the reserve:

- Barbecues and fires
- Fishing
- Water sports
- Swimming


