

Grimsargh Wetlands – Do You Want its Future Saved?

The planning application that would see the whole of the Wetlands site handed over to Grimsargh Parish has been resubmitted – application number 06/2016/0234.

If approved this would see the site protected in perpetuity and developed further as a nature reserve.

The proposal includes a small development of 12 houses fronting Preston Road – and from the proceeds of that a substantial dowry would be given to the Parish Council to pay towards immediate maintenance work and ongoing upkeep.
